NORTH MANCHESTER, IND. – Sixteen student-athletes from Manchester University received winter all-academic accolades from the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference. The teams were released Friday, March 23.

The Bluffton University softball doubleheader with Calvin College scheduled for Tuesday, March 27, has been postponed today and will be played on Monday, April 9, with game one slated for 3:30 p.m. at Bluffton Field

The Bluffton University baseball game with Capital scheduled for Tuesday, March 27 has been cancelled with no makeup date likely.

Academic all-conference selections have at least a cumulative 3.5 grade-point average and are varsity athletes. The cumulative GPA is the student-athlete's GPA at the end of the semester preceding the end of the spring season, and the student-athlete has completed the equivalent of a full academic year, full-time enrolled, at the institution to be eligible. ST. MARY'S POWERS PAST SPARTANS SOFTBALL: The big inning out of the St. Mary's College of Indiana offense proved to be the difference in a Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference – Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association match-up Monday, March 26.

The Belles, continuing a white-hot start to 2018, broke open a nip-and-tuck game one with nine runs in the sixth in route to a 14-4, six-inning victory. They came back with a combined seven tallies over the third and fourth frames of the nightcap to ensure an 8-0, six-inning triumph at Spartan Field.

Despite the two defeats that dropped them to 7-9 on the season, there was some silver lining for Manchester University. Among the positives for Coach Josh Dzurick's squad was junior catcher **Sydney Thompson (Logansport, Ind.)** going two-for-three with two runs scored in game one, and freshman hurler **Alex Whittig (Hartford City, Ind.)** holding down the blitzkrieg Belles' offense in game two to the tune of one run on only two hits over two frames. Another set of highlights came from the trio of senior **Mallorie Jennings (Bourbon, Ind.)**, sophomore **Makenzi Nyland (Avon, Ind.)** and freshman **Kendal Torrence (Lowell, Ind.)** who earned an RBI apiece in the first contest.

The Spartans begin a string of six consecutive road games Thursday, March 29. They take on another MIAA foe when they face off against Hope College of Holland, Mich. First pitch at Wolters Softball Stadium on the HC campus is 3 p.m.

LADWIG GAINS WEEKLY HONORS: Manchester University senior infielder **Laurren Ladwig (Crown Point, Ind.)** was recognized across various associations for a big week at the plate during a Florida spring break trip March 19-25.

She was tabbed the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference's and the Fastpitch News' Division III Hitter of the Week. Ladwig hit a stratospheric .625 and tallied a 1.583 slugging percentage with 15 hits, 13 runs scored, seven home runs, two doubles and 15 RBI to lead Manchester University to a 5-5 record during the Sunshine State sojourn. The remarkable story behind her numbers didn't stop there, as the Spartans' smasher tied her own single-season program record (11) for round trippers in just 14 games and went over the 100-RBI mark for her career while taking over the lead in NCAA Division III for home runs per game (.76). The Crown Point native also turned in a top-notch glove, producing a perfect fielding percentage with 18 put outs and eight assists.

Ladwig and the Black and Gold (7-9) are scheduled to return to the diamond Thursday, March 29, for a 3 p.m. doubleheader at Hope College in Holland, Mich.

MARION, Ind. – #12 Indiana Wesleyan softball flexed their muscles Wednesday night holding Huntington University scoreless in both games of the doubleheader. The Wildcats rocked the Foresters 11-0 in the first game allowing HU just one hit. IWU completed the sweep winning the second game 2-0.
