Jackson, Kim Earn Prestigious Big Ten Medal Of Honor

EVANSTON, Ill. – Record-setting student-athletes Justin Jackson and Hannah Kim have been selected as Northwestern's 2018 recipients of the prestigious Big Ten Medal of Honor, the university announced at the annual N Club Induction Banquet. Big Ten schools currently feature more than 8,200 student-athletes, but only 28 earn this award on an annual basis. Jackson rewrote the Northwestern record book during his Wildcats career. The Carol Stream, Illinois, native finished his career third in Big Ten history and tenth in NCAA history with 5,440 career rushing yards. He became just the second Big Ten player ever to rush for 1,000 yards in four-straight seasons, capping his NU career with 1,311 yards and 11 touchdowns to lead the 'Cats to a 10-3 record and their second consecutive postseason victory. He was named a consensus Second-Team All-Big Ten selection in 2017, and was honored as the Most Valuable Player in both the 2016 Pinstripe Bowl and the 2017 Music City Bowl. In addition to leaving NU as its all-time leading rusher, Jackson also ranks first in rushing attempts (1,142), rushing touchdowns (41), total touchdowns (42) and all-purpose yards (6,298). A three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree, Jackson earned his degree in economics last month, and was selected by the Los Angeles Chargers in the 2018 NFL Draft. Kim recently completed the most decorated career in Northwestern women's golf history, helping lead the 'Cats to a pair of Big Ten Conference titles and four consecutive Top-10 NCAA finishes. The Chula Vista, California, native was a three-time WGCA All-American and a two-time Golfweek All-American, and won three individual tournament titles as a collegian. The two-time Big Ten Player of the Year, and two-time Mary Fossum Award winner, became just the 12th golfer in Big Ten history to earn four First Team All-Conference honors. She owns the lowest career scoring mark in Wildcats history and three of the four-lowest single-season marks, as well as the program's 18- and 54-hole scoring records. A three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree, Kim graduated from Northwestern last month with a degree in communication studies. The Big Ten Medal of Honor is awarded to one male and one female student from the graduating class of each member institution who has demonstrated excellence on and off the field throughout their college career. The highest honor that a student competing in conference athletics can achieve in the Big Ten, the award was established in 1915 and was the first award in intercollegiate athletics to demonstrate support for the educational emphasis placed on athletics. During the past century, the Big Ten Medal of Honor has been awarded to more than 1,300 honorees. These individuals have translated their campus experience into success in all walks of life.

Northwestern's past winners include Dan & Susan Jones Family Head Football Coach Pat Fitzgerald, current Chicago Cubs pitcher Luke Farrell, and former basketball star and current UNICEF Chief Strategy & Engagement Officer Anucha Brown.

MCL Anoints Giuliano, Howell as Weekly Award Winners

Chicago, Ill. – July 2, 2018 – The Midwest Collegiate League has announced its weekly award winners for the week spanning June 25 – July 1. DuPage County outfielder **David Giuliano** (Downers Grove, Ill. / Cornell University) has been named the MCL Player of the Week, while Northwest Indiana right-handed pitcher **Christian Howell** (Trinity Christian / Aurora, Ill.) has gained the league's Pitcher of the Week honor. Giuliano had a monster week for the first-place Hounds, going 13-for-21 with four doubles, seven runs scored and six RBIs. He has enjoyed seven straight multi-hit games and leads the league with a .451 batting average to go along with a .521 on-base percentage. Giuliano's biggest day of the week was on Sunday, when he totaled six hits (four in Game 1) in a doubleheader split with Crestwood. Howell moved his record to 4-0 in Game 2 of Northwest Indiana's doubleheader sweep of Joliet on Sunday. He scattered just three hits over six scoreless innings while racking up 11 strikeouts and issuing no walks. The 11 strikeouts were one shy of matching the Oilmen single-game record, set last year by Max Franklin. Howell becomes the first Oilmen player to gain MCL Pitcher of the Week accolades this season, while Giuliano becomes the second Hound to win the Player of the Week award.

Hot Rods shutout Cubs 6-0 to open series

Garrett Kelly fans three in 2.1 innings Monday

South Bend, IN: Through jamming fastballs, soft contact, and early run support, Bowling Green Hot Rods starter Tobias Myers tossed a clean seven shutout innings against the South Bend Cubs on his way to his ninth win of 2018. To open their Fourth of July week four game series, the Hot Rods whitewashed South Bend by a final of 6-0.

The 19-year-old Myers battled along with Cubs starter Brendon Little. Little, who gave up six runs in his last start at home against West Michigan, aimed for early command of all three of his pitches. Working a 1-2-3 top of the 1st, Little got off to a solid start on Monday.

But six runs combined from innings two through four quickly set the game apart. Little ran into trouble especially in the top of the 3rd. On six hits in the 3rd frame, the Hot Rods plated four runs. Little's early command did not continue through the middle frames. With six runs of support, Myers locked in.

Myers earned the win by tossing the seven scoreless innings on 93 pitches. 58 were strikes for the right hander. The only real chance South Bend had against Myers came in the second inning when they loaded the bases. He worked out of the jam with no damage.

After Little departed, Garrett Kelly came in and settled things down for the Cubs. In 2.1 innings, Kelly had a fastball touching 95 with a solid slider. He struck out three batters. Mitch Stophel threw the final two innings while not allowing a run and striking out one batter.

The loss puts South Bend's overall record back to below .500 at 40-41. The Cubs now drop to 6-6 in the second half with game two against Bowling Green scheduled for tomorrow at 7:35 p.m. Left hander Ricky Tyler Thomas is expected to take the ball for South Bend in the final game of the nine-game homestand.

Timber Rattlers Defeat Kernels in Opener

Wisconsin rallies early for 9-3 triumph

GRAND CHUTE, WIS. – Jacob Pearson homered and drove in two quick runs Monday for the Cedar Rapids Kernels, but the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers jumped in front during the bottom of the third inning and pulled away for a 9-3 victory at Neuroscience Group Field at Fox Cities Stadium.

Pearson pushed Cedar Rapids (10-2, 42-39) to a 2-0 advantage through the top of the third. He hit a solo home run to right field in the first inning, and he plated David Bañuelos in the third with an RBI single.

The Timber Rattlers (4-7, 35-45) answered with six runs in their half of the third to take a 6-2 lead. Tristen Lutz's RBI double opened the rally, and Payton Henry later drove in the game-tying run. Gilbert Lara walked to load the bases, and KJ Harrison hit a deep fly ball to left field that was ruled fair to give Harrison his second grand slam this season.

Royce Lewis hustled home within the fifth to trim the Kernels' deficit to 6-3. He extended the inning with a single and reached second base on a wild pitch. Jose Miranda produced a groundball to shortstop, and a bobble on the transfer prior to a potential throw to first base allowed Lewis to score from second.

Wisconsin tallied the final three runs Monday to secure a 9-3 edge. Rob Henry delivered an RBI double in the fifth that brought in Lara. Gabriel García added a sacrifice fly during the seventh, and Darren Seferina led off the eighth inning with a solo home run.

Christian Taugner (4-6) held Cedar Rapids to three runs including just two earned runs over five innings pitched and received credit for the win. Tyler Watson (2-3) gave up six runs with five earned runs allowed in 2.2 frames and was tagged with the loss.

Crosby, Minor lead 'Cats to 5-1 win over Dogs in series opener

Rosemont, Ill. — Seven innings of one-run ball from Daniel Minor, a second-inning two-run home run from Alex Crosby and two scoreless innings from the bullpen led the Gary SouthShore RailCats to a 5-1 win over the Chicago Dogs in the series opener at Impact Field on Monday night. Minor (7-2) retired 11 in a row at one point and set down 15 of the final 16 batters he faced in his American Association-high seventh win (fourth consecutive) after yielding six hits, no walks and five strikeouts. Minor has also recorded five straight quality starts and is 4-0 with a 0.63 ERA and 22 strikeouts in his last four starts. Chicago (14-28) took the opening lead of the series in the first on an RBI single from Trey Vavra, snapping Minor's season-high 19.1 consecutive scoreless innings streak. Jonathan Moroney doubled to the center field wall on the first pitch of the bottom of the first before Vavra brought him around to score with an RBI single to left-center. Gary (23-19) quickly took their first lead of the series on a two-run homer down the right field line from Crosby. The home run was Crosby's second in as many days, his fourth of the season and the RailCats fifth in their last three games. The RailCats went up by four with the final three runs of the game in the eighth. Andy Paz increased the Gary lead to three with a two-run single to center before Wilfredo Gimenez made it 5-1 with a two-out RBI single to center. Jack Fowler tossed a scoreless bottom of the eighth and has now retired 35 of the last 46 batters he's faced in relief while Myles Smith struck out a pair in a scoreless bottom of the ninth. Former Cleveland Indian pitcher Scott Barnes (0-1) was tagged with his first American Association for Chicago after allowing two runs on six hits, four walks and five strikeouts over seven innings in his third start against the 'Cats. The RailCats conclude their five-game road trip on Tuesday night at 6:05 p.m. against the Chicago Dogs. LHP Alex Gunn (4-3, 4.27) makes his league-high-tying 11th start for Gary while Chicago counters with LHP Evan Smith (0-0, 4.03). Gary returns home to U.S. Steel Yard on Wednesday, July 4th, for a scheduled doubleheader against the Chicago Dogs at 5 p.m. Wednesday's game is the fifth "Office Wednesday" of the year, another NorthShore Health Centers Wednesday, and the second annual 4th of Juluuu Pig Roast, presented by Berey Bros, and Barefoot Hawaiian Luau with Fire Dancers. Wednesday's game is Independence Day and will feature a classic egg toss between games and an Independence Day Fireworks Super Show after game two of the doubleheader. Fans can also sign up for the "Office Olympics" Jersey Auction during either game on Wednesday vs. Chicago.
