Leasher Solid, But TinCaps Fall

**BOWLING GREEN, Ky.** – Starter **Aaron Leasher** put together a quality outing, but the TinCaps fell, 4-0, on Sunday afternoon against the Bowling Green Hot Rods (Tampa Bay Rays) at Bowling Green Ballpark. Leasher threw 6  $\frac{2}{3}$  innings, allowed seven hits and three runs while striking out four. The 2017 sixth-round pick out of Morehead State owns a 3.44 ERA, which is the 10<sup>th</sup> lowest in the Midwest League. Bowling Green (21-15, 68-37) got on the board in the bottom of the third inning. Vidal Brujan scored on a groundout by Moises Gomez to put the Hot Rods in front, 1-0. Bowling Green added on two more with RBI singles from Zach Rutherford and Jim Haley to push the lead to 3-0. In the bottom of the eighth, the Hot Rods struck again with an RBI single from Brujan to score Jim Haley from second and take a 4-0 edge. Fort Wayne (16-19, 48-56) had its best opportunity offensively in the bottom of the fifth, but the TinCaps were unable to get a run across with the bases loaded and two outs. In the setback, designated hitter **Gabriel Arias** extended his hit streak to five games and his on-base streak to eight games. During the on-base streak, Arias is 10-for-29 with a double, a home run, four RBIs, and four walks

## **Whitecaps whitewash Cubs in game two 3-0**

**Enrique De Los Rios throws a quality start in 2nd start this season**

Comstock Park, MI: After their bats produced just one run in the series opener last night, the South Bend Cubs had nothing going on Sunday afternoon in a matinee against the West Michigan Whitecaps. In a 3-0 defeat, South Bend dropped their fourth game in a row and fell out of first place in the Eastern Division.

The struggling offense continued on Sunday and West Michigan starter Tom de Blok dazzled in six scoring innings with six strikeouts. The Cubs did get their opportunities off of de Blok, but failed to capitalize. Going 0/7 with runners in scoring position and leaving eight men total on base, the Cubs had nothing to write home about offensively in game two.

The South Bend pitching yet again gave the Cubs a chance to win. Making just his second start of the season, Enrique De Los Rios pitched a quality start in five innings, giving up just two runs. De Los Rios took the loss, however, as there was no run support given.

Out of the bullpen, Jake Steffens continued his solid run since being called up from short-season Eugene. Steffens pitched two innings and allowed a run on two hits along with three strikeouts. Closer Brian Glowicki pitched in a non-save situation in the game. Glowicki went a perfect inning with a strikeout to lower his ERA to 1.47.

For the Whitecaps, shortstop Luke Sherley provided all the offense with a three RBI day. On two singles, Sherley was able to give West Michigan the day game win.

With the loss, South Bend falls out of the first playoff position in the Eastern Division. With an overall record of 51-54 and now 17-19 in the second half, the Cubs will hope to retaliate tomorrow night in game three of the series set for 7:05 PM.

# Sherley Ensures Whitecaps Win

COMSTOCK PARK, MI - Luke Sherley enjoyed the best performance in his short professional career by going 2-for-3 and knocking in all three runs as the West Michigan Whitecaps blanked the South Bend Cubs 3-0 in front of 5,718 fans Sunday afternoon at Fifth Third Ballpark. Sherley, the Detroit Tigers 14th round pick from Texas State in the 2018 MLB draft, enjoyed his first multiple-hit game as a Whitecap with a two-run single in the fifth inning and an RBI-single in the seventh. Pitcher Tom de Blok attempted to pick up his first victory for the Whitecaps in his seventh start of 2018 and encountered early trouble in the very first inning, but an inning-ending double play by the 'Caps defense quelled the Cubs threat. Over his last five innings of work, de Blok scattered two hits and two walks and stifling Cubs batters with a ferocious slider. Sherley gave the Whitecaps their cushion in the fifth with a seeing-eye single and his first two RBI's as a Whitecap and a 2-0 margin. West Michigan reliever Johan Belisario maintained the Whitecaps lead by dancing out of a two-on two-out situation in the seventh inning. Sherley's third RBI of the day in the seventh made the score 3-0, and Billy Lescher slammed the door on the Cubs with his first save of 2018. de Blok (1-2) earned his first win since rejoining the Whitecaps in June from Lakeland and tied a season-high with six strikeouts. Lescher pitched 1.2 innings and did not allow a base runner. The Whitecaps relief staff boasts a combined ERA of 2.88 in the second half of the 2018 season. Cubs starter Enrique De Los Rios (1-2) allowed two earned runs and five hits in five innings and suffering the loss. The Whitecaps advance to 52-53 on the year and won their third straight. South Bend dropped their fourth straight game and moved to 51-54. Both teams remain firmly in contention for highly contested playoff spots in the Midwest League second half.
