D3football.com pre-season All-America

BLUFFTON, Ohio - Senior Isaac Zickafoose (Middlebury, Ind./Northridge) has been named a pre-season Second Team All-America selection by d3football.com. A two-time All-Region selection, Zickafoose was the HCAC Defensive Player of the Year as a sophomore in 2016.

Zickafoose battled double and triple teams on his way to a third straight First Team All-Heartland Conference honor last season. The talented defensive end was second on the team with 51 tackles, 12.0 yards TFL's and 5.0 sacks. His six quarterback hurries tied Ryan Aelker for first on Bluffton's single-season list.

He was the HCAC Player of the Week following his otherworldly performance in Bluffton's 56-14 dismantling of Anderson on Homecoming Saturday. He tallied six solo tackles, a forced fumble, three sacks and four tackles-for-loss. His sacks set AU back 32 yards and he forced a fumble on the third sack, picked it up and returned it for a score midway through the third quarter. The junior blocked a punt that Kay Boakye scooped up and ran back for a Bluffton touchdown late in the first half. He also scooted for 17 yards on a fake punt to keep the chains moving in the second quarter, and finished with a quarterback hurry and pass breakup. The Beaver defense allowed only 178 yards of offense with four total rushing yards. Zickafoose is second all-time at Bluffton with 24 career sacks, 243 TFL yards and five fumble recoveries. He is third with 43.5 TFL's, 176 sack yards and his 14 quarterback hurries are tops all-time at Bluffton.

The Plymouth girls golf team got their season started in fine fashion Monday afternoon at the Harrison Invitational at Coyote Crossing in West Lafayette. The ladies put forth an excellent effort 435 good for 9th.

Senior Brittney Klotz led the charge for the ladies with a 95. Brittney's 95 was only four shots off her career-round from last season, a round that qualified her for the 2017 Regional. Brittney's opening tee shot on #7 missed the fairway by inches, her confident approach landed within eight feet and a led to a solid opening par. A highlight of her round was a four-hole stretch from 18-3 where she played them a collective +1. Brittney also led the team with 5 pars. Britt's dedication in the off-season has her primed for a successful senior campaign. Her leadership and experience are essential to our unit this season. Junior Olivia Waymouth put together methodical and consistent nines of 51 & 53 for a career-best 104. Livi dusted her best by 15 shots! The driver and putter helped her find the fairway and limit the dreaded 3-putts to only two occasions. As solid as her round was, she left a few shots out there, sparking motivation for future rounds. Sophomore Olivia Horvath also drove the ball well today and finessed several fine wedges into the greens. Olivia's 111 smashed her career best by 22 shots today! Like her teammates, Olivia's off-season preparation has led to better shot making, confidence, and moxie. I was really proud of Freshmen Anastasia Hutchings 125 today. Some early nerves playing on a big stage alongside some talented upperclassmen was a tall order. Anna settled into her round, worked to couple quality shots together and fight to the finish. She has also worked long hours to prepare for this season. Her grit and hard work will begin to pay dividends.

As a team this year's 435 was an improvement of 32 shots from last season! This year's field was slightly smaller, however more talented than a year ago. NLC foe Northwood took home top honors carding a pair of 77's. The ladies from Nappanee are poised to take their game deep into the post-season yet again. Lafayette Jeff and Crown Point finished right behind Northwood. Both Jeff and CP were paired with us today. Our girls got to witness, learn, and experience what it takes to be a top 20 team.

## **Whitecaps sweep Cubs with 6-5 series finale finish**

*Austin Filiere picks up three hits and a walk on Tuesday*

Comstock Park, MI: The South Bend Cubs thought their woes had come to an end after they plated four runs in the top of the 1st inning off of West Michigan Whitecaps starter Dane Myers. After being shutout in the previous two days, the Cubs possessed the commanding lead after just a half an inning. But the Whitecaps came roaring back and were able to hold on in the end, beating the Cubs 6-5.

An immediate rally aided South Bend in the series finale. With nothing going for the bats in games two and three, Zach Davis singled up the middle to start the game. Showing signs of life, the Cubs offense eventually picked up RBI in the inning from Christian Donahue and Delvin Zinn. With a pair of RBI each, the Cubs were in front 4-0.

West Michigan did not hold back. Against Cubs starter Erling Moreno, the Whitecaps scored twice in both the 1st and 2nd innings to tie the game at 4-4.

After the 2nd inning, Moreno put an end to the Whitecaps comeback. He locked in for the next five frames. Sending down West Michigan in order from innings three through seven, Moreno fired back and put himself in a position to be in line for the win if the Cubs could score.

Unfortunately for the Chicago Cubs top-30 prospect, an error in the bottom of the 8th inning made by shortstop Rafael Narea led to two more runs for West Michigan. In total, the Cubs made four errors on Tuesday night.

Down to their final three outs, the Cubs offense again showed signs of life in the 9th inning. Down to his last strike, Zach Davis started a two out rally against reliever Billy Lescher with a double down the left field line.

With their fastest runner on second, Narea was hit by a pitch, giving Cubs number one overall prospect an opportunity. On a RBI single up the middle, Amaya drove in his 47th RBI of the season, bringing the Cubs within a run.

With the tying run at third base, Austin Filiere dribbled a ball to the third baseman Colby Bortles. On a bang-bang play at first base, Bortles threw out Filiere to end the game. It was a 6-5 series finale sweep win for the Whitecaps in game four.

With the loss, the Cubs fall to 51-56 on the season and 17-21 in the second half. South Bend will now continue their 10 game road trip and head to Lansing to take on the Lugnuts tomorrow for the first of three games. First pitch from Michigan's capital is set for 7:05 PM.

Fernandez Lifts TinCaps in Series-Finale Win

**FORT WAYNE, Ind.** – Catcher **Juan Fernandez** hit a three-run home run in the top of the ninth inning to lift the TinCaps over the Bowling Green Hots Rods (Tampa Bay Rays), 7-4, in the series finale at Bowling Green Ballpark on Tuesday afternoon. With the win, the TinCaps split the series with the Hot Rods.

Fort Wayne (17-20, 49-57) and Bowling Green (22-16, 69-38) were tied in the top of the ninth inning with two outs and runners at first and second when Fernandez cranked a 0-1 fastball over the wall in left field to plate three and put the TinCaps in front for good, 7-4.

The TinCaps cracked a 23-inning scoring drought in the top of the first. Second baseman **Kelvin Melean** hit a ground-rule double to left-center field to score center fielder **Jeisson Rosario** from second and put the TinCaps ahead, 1-0.

The Hot Rods responded with four unanswered runs during the first and second innings, headlined by a two-run home run by Taylor Walls to take a 4-1 lead.

In the top of the fifth, Fort Wayne scored two runs off of an error and a wild pitch to cut the Bowling Green advantage down to 4-3.

The TinCaps tied the game in the bottom of the seventh. Melean and Rosario were attempting a double steal when second baseman Vidal Brujan threw the ball into foul territory during a run down to send Rosario home and even the game at 4-4 to set up for the Fernandez home run in the top of the ninth.

In the win, Melean went 4-for-5 with a double and an RBI to increase his batting average to .304 in 20 games with Fort Wayne. Also, reliever **Travis Radke** threw 2 1/3 perfect innings out of the 'pen to record the win.
