# Cubs drop 7th straight in 10-3 series opener loss to Lansing

Lansing, MI: The South Bend Cubs are just 1-9 in their past 10 games. For a team that is struggling to score runs over the past week and a half, South Bend was not able to keep the Lansing Lugnuts bats quiet in their series opener on Wednesday night. Dropping game one by a final of 10-3, the Cubs have now lost seven games in a row, including all five games so far on the road trip.

Sending Midwest League All-Star Javier Assad to the mound in the opener, the Cubs struggled to give the right hander early run support. Lansing got on the board first with the help of a two run home run by Ryan Noda in the bottom of the 1st inning. Very quickly, it became a 2-0 Lugnuts lead.

The Cubs fired back and looked to mount a comeback as they plated a run in the top of the 3rd, making the game 2-1. But that rally was immediately answered by seven straight runs by Lansing in the bottom of the 4th inning.

Assad was pulled from the game with one out in the 4th. He takes his sixth loss of the season with eight runs allowed on five hits. The 21-year-old walked four batters and struck out three. Shining for the Lugnuts was Noda, who finished his night with two home runs. With two runs scored and five RBI, Noda brings his batting average up to .259.

For South Bend, Zach Davis produced a two hit night batting in the two hole for the first time this season. Jimmy Herron, Clayton Daniel, and Brandon Hughes brought in the three Cubs runs.

With the loss, the Cubs fall to 51-57 overall and 17-22 in the second half. They will hope to break the skid and even up the series tomorrow night in game two against the Lugnuts. First pitch from Cooley Law School Stadium is set for 7:05 PM.

### Women's Hoops Unveils Challenging 2018-19 Schedule

**KALAMAZOO**, **Mich.** – The Western Michigan women's basketball team unveiled both its non-conference schedule and Mid-American Conference home/away assignments for the upcoming 2018-19 season, seventh-year head coach <u>Shane Clipfell</u> announced Wednesday.

"We are thrilled with the challenging schedule we have put together for our team and for our fans," commented Clipfell. "We know we have to challenge ourselves because of the rigors of our conference schedule. Out schedule is highlighted by a home game with the University of Michigan and a road trip to SEC opponent Ole Miss. The MAC has proven itself on the national stage and we expect more of the same this season. Our non-conference schedule will prepare us for the competition that our conference presents for us."The Brown & Gold finished 18-15 overall, 9-9 in the conference and finished third in the ultra-competitive west division to conclude the 2017-18 season. The Broncos made a trip to the MAC Tournament Semifinals for the second consecutive year and second time since 2003 after upsetting three-seeded and WNIT participant Ball State in the quarterfinals. Western Michigan opens the season with three straight games inside University Arena with the season opener versus Fort Wayne on Nov. 8. New Mexico State (Nov. 11) and NCAA Tournament team Michigan preface a trip to SEC affiliate Ole Miss on Nov. 18. From there, the Broncos return home to host Eastern Kentucky (Nov. 28) and Loyola (Dec. 3). The lone tournament the Broncos will participate in will be the Stetson Tournament in December to conclude the non-conference season. WMU will face North Dakota and Mississippi Valley State on Dec. 20 & 21 but not before traveling to Detroit on Dec. 9 and Florida Atlantic on Dec. 16. The MAC also released its home/away assignments for the upcoming season on Wednesday morning. The schedule will feature 18 games, including nine at home and nine on the road. Coming to University Arena this season are Akron, WNIT participants Ball State, Miami and Toledo, NCAA Sweet 16 teams Buffalo and Central Michigan, Eastern Michigan, Kent State and Northern Illinois. Seven opponents will be faced twice during the conference regular season in Akron, Ball State, Central Michigan, Eastern Michigan, Kent State, Northern Illinois, and Toledo while the Broncos travel to Bowling Green and Ohio in the sole matchups of the season.WMU's conference opener will take place at Bowling Green Saturday, Jan. 8 at the Stroh Center. The MAC home opener is scheduled for Jan. 9 versus Akron in Kalamazoo, Mich.
