Patiño Strikes Out Career-High Nine in TinCaps Win

FORT WAYNE, Ind. – Starting pitcher **Luis Patiño** struck out a career-high nine batters as the TinCaps beat the West Michigan Whitecaps (Detroit Tigers), 5-2, on Sunday afternoon at Parkview Field. With the victory, Fort Wayne retains its position for the Midwest League Eastern Division's second half wild card playoff spot. The TinCaps (22-26, 54-63) now trail the Whitecaps (24-24, 60-58) by two games for the second half's top playoff seed. In this clash of 'Caps, the visitors took an early lead. Reynaldo Rivera had a first-inning RBI single for West Michigan, but that was the only run the Whitecaps would score against Patiño, the 18-year-old from Colombia. Patiño, who reached 99 miles per hour with his fastball, struck out nine in five innings of work. Meanwhile, at the plate, Fort Wayne equalized and went ahead in the second. Left fielder **Hunter Jarmon** and center fielder **Jeisson Rosario** both delivered two-out RBI singles to give the TinCaps a 2-1 lead. The home team added to its lead with a run in the fifth, as first baseman **Jalen Washington** executed on a squeeze bunt to score shortstop **Gabriel Arias**.

The TinCaps stretched their lead to 5-1 in the sixth with both right fielder **Jack Suwinski** and second baseman **Esteury Ruiz** providing RBI singles. West Michigan threatened with a run in the seventh, but got no closer. **Reiss Knehr** (two innings), **Evan Miller** (one inning), and **Dylan Coleman** (one inning), who notched his first save with Fort Wayne, followed Patiño in relief. The TinCaps drew a crowd of 7,459 fans on Sunday. That means Parkview Field is only 11,248 fans away from reaching the 4,000,000-fan milestone since opening in 2009. The team will be giving away \$10,000 in prizes on the night the 4 millionth fan enters the gates in the ballpark's 10th season. [Click here](#) for more details.

Senior Brittney Klotz once again led the way for the Pilgrims with a 92. Brittney had the flat stick working well. She led our team in the number of 1-putts for the round and least amount of 3-putts. Even better than the putter was her driver. Britt hit 10 of 14 fairways, only missing two opportunities each side. Key to Brittney's play was her ability to score on par 3's. She parred 3 of the 4 today. Brittney's senior experience and course knowledge was a big factor today. Also putting her course knowledge to work was Junior Olivia Waymouth 106. Two of Livi's three pars came on par 3 holes. Both of her greens-in-regulation we're par 3 holes. She like Brittney hit the ball well with the driver. Olivia's positioning off the tee was excellent and paved the way for decent approaches. With Sophomore Olivia Horvath out of town, I was impressed by the way our underclassmen stepped up to the challenge. Anastasia Hutchings 123, Brenna Large 134, Hannah LaVine 144. Each played a position a bit over their head today and all three held their composure quite well. Each showed solid improvement inside their round. Quality of contact, the velocity of fairway shots, and improved distance control with wedge shots we're all signs of good things to come. Most impressive was our ability to limit the mercy rule of 10 shots per hole. No one on the team had more than 2 for their entire round! Previous matches we've played a double par maximum. For example a par 3 max score would be a 6. With today's maximum at 10 shots, regardless of par, there was more ceiling for higher scoring. Looking ahead to the end of the season, today's scores were much more reflective of a true score. The girls are back in action Monday at Pretty Lake where they host LaVille, Tippecanoe Valley, and Bremen.

South Bend snaps four game skid in Sunday matinee

Cubs tie series against Lake County with victory

South Bend, IN: The South Bend Cubs defeated the Lake County Captains in game two of a four game series on Sunday afternoon from Four Winds Field by a final of 5-4 in a game where they started in last place. With the win, the Cubs bring themselves out of the cellar in the Eastern Division and tie the series against the Captains.

A late Lake County run in the final five innings put a scare on South Bend, as at one point the Cubs led 5-1. But by sticking with it, South Bend held on to win the game and tie the series. Starter Enrique De Los Rios pitched a quality start in five innings. With just two runs allowed, De Los Rios struck out two batters and shut the door for the first half of the game.

Offensively, the Cubs gave De Los Rios plenty of run support with five runs combined in the 3rd and 4th innings. The big rally South Bend has been looking for over the course of this seven-game homestand came alive in the 4th, as the Cubs plated four runs off of starter Juan Hillman.

Hillman exited the game after four innings with five runs allowed on six hits and two walks. He takes the loss in this one and drops his record to 3-12. De Los Rios earned the win and Brian Glowicki picked up his 16th save of the season.

Glowicki allowed two unearned runs over the course of his two innings of work. He closed the game handily in the top of the 9th to pick up the six out save. His ERA continues to fall and now has reached 1.23.

Top performers for South Bend included the duo of Delvin Zinn and Cam Balego. Zinn went 2/4 with his third RBI in two games of the series. Balego was a do-it-all player on Sunday with catching all nine innings and picking up a hit, RBI, run, and two walks at the plate.

Now with the series tied, the Cubs record improves to 55-63 overall and 21-28 in the second half. They will look to take the series lead tomorrow night in game three as the Cubs and Captains square off again from Four Winds Field. First pitch is set for 7:05 PM.

Bethel to Add Swimming & Diving, Tabs Deb Thompson as Coach

MISHAWAKA, Ind. – Athletic Director Tom Visker is pleased to announce that Bethel College will offer men's and women's swimming and diving as varsity programs for the 2018-19 academic year. The addition of swimming & diving, as well as bowling announced earlier this summer, will bring Bethel to a total of 23 varsity programs competing in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), and 29 intercollegiate teams total. The Pilots most recently added competitive cheer during the 2016-17 academic year. "Northern Indiana and the surrounding states have many great swimming and diving programs in the high school and club circuit. We are excited to be one of only a few small colleges offering swimming and diving programs in this region," noted Visker. "I'm confident we can build a competitive program while providing many more student-athletes a quality, faith-based education." The Pilots will join Indiana Wesleyan as the only Crossroads League schools to offer the NAIA championship-sponsored sport. The swimming & diving program will make their home venue the brand-new Elkhart Health, Fitness, Aquatics, and Community Center in Elkhart and will begin recruiting and filling the roster immediately before officially competing in 2019-20. Student-athletes interested in competing in men's and women's swimming & diving at Bethel can complete and submit a prospective student-athlete [questionnaire](#). Additionally, Visker has tabbed Deb Thompson as the first head coach in men's and women's swimming & diving program history at Bethel. Thompson comes to the Pilots with 27 years of combined experience coaching swimming & diving, including 16 years at the collegiate level with stops at Oberlin (Ohio), Washington & Lee (Va.), Drexel (Pa.), SUNY Geneseo (N.Y.), and UW Whitewater (Wis.). Thompson's team won 11 conference titles at SUNY Geneseo. She coached a total of 50 All-Americans and was named a Coach of the Year six times. For the past 11 years, Thompson has held the position of the Physical Education and Health Teacher at St. Joseph High School in South Bend, where she was also the Department Chair. Thompson has also served as an Adjunct Professor in the Kinesiology Department at Bethel since 2011. "We are very grateful to find such an experienced and successful head coach for our swimming and diving program right here in Michiana," observed Visker. "Deb is a great fit for our department and the college. I look forward to seeing the positive athletic, academic, and spiritual impact she will have on our swimmers and divers." After a stellar swimming career at Penn High School where she won two IHSAA state titles and set a state record, Thompson swam collegiately at Purdue University (Ind.) and was a member of two school record-setting relay teams and participated in the NCAA national championships. Thompson holds a Masters in Sports Administration from Kent State (Ohio), during which time she served an internship with the NAIA as an Assistant Meet Director for the NAIA National Championship. The Osceola-native is a member of the Indiana High School Swimming and Diving Hall of Fame as the first female to break the 2:00.00 barrier in the 200-yard free in IHSAA history. "I feel very blessed to have this opportunity to work at Bethel College and start the men's and women's swimming and diving team," described Thompson. "I look forward to seeing where God takes us on this new adventure."
