Cubs squeeze their way to 2-1 win over Lake County

Jimmy Herron picks up game winning RBI in the 8th

South Bend, IN: As game three of their four game series headed to the bottom of the 8th inning with a 1-1 tie, Miguel Amaya decided it was time to elevate the South Bend Cubs into the lead over the Lake County Captains.

To begin a much needed rally, Amaya smashed a leadoff double and picked up his second extra base hit in August. A batter later, Austin Filiere lined his second hit of the day up the middle to bring Amaya to third base. Filiere was the only Cub to record two base knocks in a 2-1 win.

With the game deciding RBI, rookie Jimmy Herron got the squeeze bunt sign from Manager Jimmy Gonzalez on the third base line. On a perfect bunt dribbling to the right of the chalk third base side, the squeeze was a success and Amaya crossed home plate. Herron recorded his 10th RBI with South Bend.

Righty Manuel Rodriguez then finished off the Captains with a 1-2-3 9th inning. However, to earn the win, South Bend needed to fight and claw their way into the lead for all nine innings. Defensively, South Bend got a break in the top of the 4th inning via a wacky double play.

On a ground ball hit off of starter Erling Moreno to first base, Will Benson grounded into a 3-5-2-6-4 double play. Cam Balego picked up the sharply hit ground ball. He then fired to third baseman Austin Filiere, who threw to catcher Miguel Amaya. Amaya tossed the ball to shortstop Rafael Narea, who tagged the lead runner Josh Rolette in between third and home. Finally, Narea threw to second baseman Delvin Zinn. Zinn chased down Benson and tagged him out beside the first base bag.

Overall, Moreno finished with seven innings of one run ball in a no-decision effort. Rodriguez picked up the win for his third of the season.

Now winning back-to-back games, South Bend will have the opportunity for the series victory tomorrow night as right hander Jeffrey Passantino takes the mound. First pitch from Four Winds Field is set for 7:05 PM.

2018 PREVIEW: Women's Soccer resolved for success

WINONA LAKE, Ind. - Grace's women's soccer team, built on a foundation of returners, is poised for a bounce back year in 2018. The Lady Lancers narrowly missed out on qualifying for a national tournament last fall, snapping a streak of six straight national appearances. That experience has left the squad hungry for a return trip to nationals in 2018, according to Grace head coach Michael Voss. Voss, the winningest coach in program history with 126 wins in 11 seasons, has recruited several talented newcomers to boost the team's depth. Several of those players have the ability to start right away. "The ladies are ready. They come into this season with high expectations. They are resolved, and they know what they need to do to live out their goals," Voss said. Grace excelled in possession last year. Voss was pleased with the team's ability to control and move the ball against teams in 2017. As a team, Grace outshot the majority of its opponents and averaged 19 shots per game. The Lady Lancers' finishing touch, however, was missing. Grace averaged just over one goal per game, less than that in Crossroads League play. Voss is confident that Grace's possession will again be a strong point of the team. Grace's midfield should be as deep and experienced as ever. Corinne Villalobos, Sacia Hanson, Kristen Bellinger, Allison Vroon, McKenna Cruz, Clair Snodgrass, Flavia Faria and Riley Koch give Voss a gluttony of combinations to play in the middle. They combined for 88 starts last year. Shelby Fort, Liz Van Wormer and Jenni Phillips return as forwards. Each player brings pace and relentlessness in attack. The forwards will be joined by freshmen Baylei Peters and Natalie Williams. Peters, in particular, has looked dangerous in preseason so far, according to Voss. She is a crafty player with a knack for finishing shots. New midfielders in the rotation include Cassidy Wasson, Sarah Casteel and Joana Schimmel. Schimmel returns to Grace's team after playing as a freshman in 2016. Casteel and Wasson are smart, technical midfielders who can play multiple positions.

Defensively, Grace will have to overcome the loss of center back Hannah Tkacz, who will miss the season due to injury. Returners Aubrey Feipel and Liz Aalbue give Grace experience, and Cruz and Bellinger also have played extensively in the back line. A pair of freshmen, Brooke Kohler and Anna Kuhl, will have a chance to play immediately as defenders. Kuhl provides a composed presence, and Kohler is confident on the ball and in distribution from the back. They will be anchored by freshman goalkeeper Bethany Blackwood, who has the unenviable task of replacing graduated All-American Abby Schue. Blackwood is an athletic keeper who has tremendous potential, according to Voss. "She wants to grow and be a great goalkeeper. She has a passion to work and train hard, and she will be a good player for us," Voss said. To reach Grace's collective potential, the Lady Lancers will need to maintain its level of possession. But Voss knows that Grace must put the ball in the back of the net more for the 2018 campaign to end in a national tournament. "We have to be more efficient and productive to score goals," Voss said. "We're really good at moving the ball. We are technical and composed on the ball, but we have to be more brave going to goal. We need to finish and put teams away." The Lady Lancers will have an exhibition match at home on Friday 7 p.m. against Ancilla at 1st Source Bank Field. Grace will then travel to Iowa on Aug. 24-25 to open the year at Graceland and Grand View.
