### **Gore Matches Career High & Suwinski Homers Again in Series-Finale Win**

**FORT WAYNE, Ind.** – Left fielder **Jack Suwinski** homered for a second consecutive night and his fourth time in his last 14 games as the TinCaps defeated the West Michigan Whitecaps (Detroit Tigers), 5-1, in the series finale on Tuesday night at Parkview Field. With the win, the TinCaps won the series and also moved into a tie with West Michigan for the top playoff spot in the Midwest League East Division's second half. TinCaps starter **MacKenzie Gore** threw six innings, allowed six hits, one run, and struck out five with no walks or batters hit. Since coming off the Disabled List for a second time with a blister issue on June 10, Gore has made 12 starts, going 49.0 innings, and posting a 3.12 ERA with 60 strikeouts against 14 walks. This was the second time Gore had gone six innings to match his professional career-long. Fort Wayne (24-26, 56-63) helped Gore offensively in the bottom of the first. With two outs in the inning, first baseman **Nick Feight** singled to left field to score shortstop **Owen Miller** from second and put the TinCaps ahead, 1-0. West Michigan (24-26, 60-60) responded with a run in the top of the third. Kody Clemens hit a ground ball up the middle to score Luke Sherley and tie the game at 1-1. But the TinCaps reclaimed the lead in the bottom of the third when Suwinski hit a sacrifice fly to deep right to score third baseman **Olivier Basabe** and give Fort Wayne a 2-1 advantage. In the home half of the sixth, Suwinski belted a solo shot 395 feet to right-center field for his second blast in as many days to give the TinCaps a 3-1 edge. In his last 14 games, Suwinski is slashing .380/.441/.720 with five doubles, four home runs, and 13 RBIs. Fort Wayne added two more runs in the seventh and eighth to pull away for the 5-1 victory. In the win, Suwinski, Miller and designated hitter **Esteury Ruiz** all finished with multi-hit games. Meanwhile, the TinCaps will welcome their 4 millionth fan to Parkview Field on Wednesday night when they open a three-game series against the South Bend Cubs. Anyone present on Wednesday, with a valid TinCaps ticket, will be eligible to be selected as the 4,000,000<sup>th</sup> fan. One fan will receive \$4,000 in TinCaps hospitality, season tickets, merchandise, and prizes, as well as the designation as the TinCaps 4,000,000<sup>th</sup> fan. Ten other fans will receive \$400 gift cards and 20 fans will receive \$100 gift cards for a grand total of \$10,000 to be given away.

## **Berardi's bomb beats Cubs in 10th to finish homestand**

*South Bend will begin a three game set in Fort Wayne tomorrow*

South Bend, IN: In a back and forth, low scoring first nine innings, the South Bend Cubs and Lake County Captains headed to extra innings for the first time in their four game series. With an epic comeback, Jimmy Herron and the Cubs tied the game in the 9<sup>th</sup> to head to the 10<sup>th</sup>.

But as the game went to the 10<sup>th</sup>, Lake County started their own rally and beat the Cubs 5-2.

On a wise move by Manager Jimmy Gonzalez, he inserted infielder Christian Donahue into the game to start the bottom of the 9<sup>th</sup> inning. Down 2-0, the Cubs needed a rally. Donahue started the inning with a double down the left field line. South Bend had the opportunity to tie it with the go-ahead run at the plate. Eventually, the bases were loaded.

Herron ripped a sharp line drive into right field. Easily, Donahue scored. Rafael Narea hustled around the third base bag and scored the tying run. The game was tied 2-2.

In the top of the 10<sup>th</sup>, it was Ben Hecht's responsibility to keep the game even. But on a delivery to shortstop Jesse Berardi, he blasted a three run home run over the right field wall towards the 1<sup>st</sup> Source Bank Performance Center. In a flash, it was a three run, 5-2 Captains lead.

In the bottom of the 10<sup>th</sup>, South Bend began the inning with their automatic runner at second base in Cam Balego. Balego took third base on a groundout, but was not able to score. The Cubs dropped game four 5-2 and the series was split two games apiece.

With the loss, the Cubs fall to 56-64 on the season. Tomorrow, South Bend will begin an enormous three game series against the Fort Wayne TinCaps on the road. Fort Wayne, who is ahead of the Cubs in the standings, is currently in a playoff spot. On the mound tomorrow, South Bend will send right hander Javier Assad to the mound from Parkview Field.

**.Cats even series behind 3-run second and McKenzie's 6 strong innings**

*Winnipeg and Gary play one another for the final time during the regular season on Wednesday at 7:10 p.m.*

**GARY, Ind.** — A three-run second, six innings of two-run ball from Jeff McKenzie and three scoreless innings of relief from the Gary bullpen led the RailCats to a 5-2 win over the Winnipeg Goldeyes with 3,318 in attendance on Tuesday night at U.S. Steel Yard. Gary never trailed on the night and remain in a first-place tie in the North Division with St. Paul after the Saints defeated the Sioux Falls Canaries on the night. Gary (45-35) took the opening lead for the second consecutive night with a three-run second inning. Colin Willis recorded the RailCats first hit and extended his career-and-season-high on-base streak to 31 games with a single to center to begin the frame. Tillman Pugh followed Willis with a six-pitch walk to increase his on-base streak to 27, giving the 'Cats runners on first and second. Andy Paz then followed with an RBI double down the first base line, however, Goldeyes shortstop Josh Mazzola muffed the relay throw into second base, allowing Pugh to score from first. Paz's RBI double also increased his season-high hitting streak to 16 games. D.K. Carey then made it 3-0 with an RBI double down the right field line, scoring Paz for the final run of the inning. Winnipeg (36-46) trimmed the Gary lead to 3-2 with their only runs in the third. Josh Romanski recorded the second of his three hits with a two-out single to center before Reggie Abercrombie clobbered a two-run home run off the RailCats video board in left-center. The RailCats went back in front by three with two more runs in the sixth. Will Savage led off the frame with a single to left before Randy Santiesteban belted a two-run home run off the net beyond the left field wall. McKenzie (5-9) went at least six innings for the fourth consecutive time and ended his three-game losing streak after yielding eight hits, a walk and three strikeouts in his 16th start of the year. Michigan City, Ind., native Robbie Coursel (1) recorded a hold with a scoreless top of the seventh in his Independent Professional baseball debut. Coursel's Gary debut was also his first appearance in nearly two years. Myles Smith (6) recorded his second straight hold with a scoreless top of eighth and Adam Quintana (7) earned his second straight save with a perfect bottom of the ninth. Alex Boshers (3-9) was tagged with the loss after allowing five runs on seven hits, a walk and three strikeouts over six innings. Gary and Winnipeg play one another for the final time during the regular season on Wednesday at 7:10 p.m. RailCats RHP Gabe Perez (4-1, 3.32) makes his 10th start against Goldeyes LHP Kevin McGovern (4-9, 4.51) in the series finale.
