Cubs hold on to beat Hot Rods 5-4 in series finale

South Bend finishes 10-game road trip at 3-7

Bowling Green, KY: It came down to the wire, but the South Bend Cubs snuck past the Bowling Green Hot Rods on Monday afternoon to take their weekend series two games out of three to end their 10-game road trip. With a final of 5-4, the Cubs end the long away trip with a record of 3-7. Overall, South Bend improves to 54-59 on the season. They are still very much in contention for the postseason, coming in before the game today at just one game out of the wild card spot in the Eastern Division. Now, if Dayton loses tonight to West Michigan, South Bend has the possibility to be tied for the second half wild card position. Monday's matinee from Bowling Green Ballpark went exactly the way South Bend needed it to for the first seven innings. Dominant pitching from your starting pitcher? Check. Erling Moreno had his best start in a Cubs uniform in 2018 against the Hot Rods. In 6.2 masterful innings of scoreless baseball, Moreno allowed just five hits and struck out four batters. He earned the win to bring his record to 1-3. On 85 pitches, Moreno fired in 52 strikes. Early timely hitting from your batting order? Check. With the first five runs of the ballgame, South Bend plated a run in the top of the 1st thanks to leadoff man Jose Gutierrez. Gutierrez, who was sent to the Cubs from Myrtle Beach earlier in the series, clobbered his second home run in as many days to open the scoring. Three more runs came in the top of the 3rd off of Bowling Green starter Alex Valverde. The right hander Valverde took the loss in the rubber match and sees his record fall to 5-7. Heading to the bottom of the 8th, South Bend was cruising with a 5-0 lead. Then, the Bowling Green bats woke up. After Moreno exited, right hander Jake Steffens needed just one pitch to get the final out of the 7th inning. But in the 8th, Steffens allowed three runs on four hits in two-thirds of an inning. Reliever Ben Hecht then had to come in to get the Cubs out of the jam. He escaped by getting the final out with no further damage. In the 9th, it was the same story. Hecht trotted out to the mound for his first full inning. Bowling Green was able to plate a run to make the game 5-4, but that was all they were able to get against the right hander Hecht. With the tying run at second base, and the winning run at the plate, Hecht got Ronaldo Hernandez to ground out to end the game. The Cubs took the finale 5-4 and now leave Bowling Green with a series win. Next up for South Bend is a seven game homestand where they will face the Great Lakes Loons and Lake County Captains. With an off day tomorrow, the Cubs will take on the Loons in game one of a three game set with first pitch coming at 7:05 PM on Wednesday

TinCaps Fall in Seven-Inning Series Finale

FORT WAYNE, Ind. – The TinCaps fell to the Lansing Lugnuts (Toronto Blue Jays), 5-4, in a rain-shortened seven-inning game on Monday night at Parkview Field. The game went into a rain delay before the eighth inning started and after a 35 minute delay with down-pouring rain, the game was officially called. TinCaps (19-24, 51-61) starter **Luis Patiño** threw five scoreless innings with only one hit before allowing a leadoff double in the top of the sixth to Jesus Navarro. Patiño, the second youngest pitcher in the Midwest League, finished throwing 5 1/3 innings, allowing three hits, one earned run, and matching his career best with eight strikeouts. Meanwhile, Fort Wayne helped Patiño offensively by scoring in the bottom of the third inning. With two outs, right fielder **Jack Suwinski** hit a ground ball through the hole into right field to score center fielder **Jeisson Rosario** from third and put the TinCaps ahead, 1-0. Shortstop **Gabriel Arias** followed with a double to left-center field to score Suwinski from first and give Fort Wayne a 2-0 advantage. Lansing (24-20, 67-47) got things clicking offensively in the top of the sixth. After Navarro doubled to lead off the inning, Samad Taylor hit an RBI single up the middle to score Navarro and cut the deficit to 2-1. Later in the inning, Taylor scored on a passed ball to tie the game, 2-2. The Lugnuts plated two more runs on a wild pitch and an RBI single from Reggie Pruitt to take a 4-2 lead. The TinCaps responded in the bottom of the frame. First baseman **Nick Feight** doubled to score Arias from second and pull Fort Wayne within one, 4-3. Later in the inning, third baseman **Kelvin Melean** doubled to left-center field to score Feight and tie the game at 4-4. The Lugnuts broke the tie in the top of the seventh inning when Navarro scored from third base on a passed ball to give Lansing a 5-4 edge. Suwinski extended his hitting streak to seven games, while Arias stretched his on-base streak to a career-long 16 contests. The ‘Caps out-hit the ‘Nuts, 9-6, but were in part done in by four errors (to Lansing’s one) and three passed balls (to Lansing’s one).
