AKRON, Ohio - The Bluffton University women's cross country team made history at Silver Metro State Park as they garnered their best All-Ohio Championships finish in school history with a 10th place showing on Saturday Sept. 29!

Bluffton placed 22nd out of 38 teams competing across all divisions on Saturday, knocking off several Div. II foes, including Ashland University, the University of Findlay and Tiffin University.

The Beavers were led by junior <u>Alexis Cash</u> (Gaines, Michl./Lake Fenton), who also made Bluffton history as the top individual finisher in school history, crossing the line 20th in Division III with a time of 23:37.6. The time is also the 8th-fastest mark in school history and her best time of 2018. Cash was followed closely by senior <u>Jennie Matteson</u>(Guysville/Alexander) who placed 39th with a time of 24:00.1.

The key to Bluffton's team success came with the back half of the team, as runners three, four, and five all placed within 11 spots of each other in the front half of the pack. Sophomore <u>Kimberly Hetrick</u> (Fremont/Ross) took 60th with a time of 24:38.2, while sophomore <u>Bailie Barrington</u> (Waynesfield/Waynesfield-Goshen) and junior <u>Arie Cox</u> (Ontario) came away with lifetime six-kilometer personal-best times of 24:41.0 and 24:54.9 to round out the scoring five for the Beavers.

The men's team came across with their best performance of the season on Saturday as well, with multiple personal bests coming from their eight-kilometer race. Senior Jonah Eckert (Terre Haute, Ind./West Vigo) led the charge with a lifetime personal-best of 26:26.6, finishing 44th out of Division III competitors. Juniors Dakota Frost (Hicksville) and Connor Gulick (St. Louisville/Utica) followed Eckert through the line with top 70 finishes and times of 27:11.1 and 27:20.4, respectively, Gulick's mark being a personal best.

The Beavers hit another two weeks of tough training before returning to action at the Oberlin College Inter-Regional Rumble on Saturday, Oct. 13, with their final tune-up before the HCAC Championship meet. The women will run at 10:30 a.m. with the men to follow at 11:15 a.m.

LIBERTY, Ind. - The Bluffton University women's golf team shot a 447 during day one of the HCAC Preview at Liberty, Ind., on Saturday, Sept. 29, 2018.

<u>Abby Bullion</u> (Bellevue, Ohio) led the way with an even 100, while <u>Keely Briggs</u> (Franklin, Ohio) was just five strokes back at 105. <u>Brylee Oberdorf</u> (Green Springs, Ohio) and <u>Kourtney Kretschmar</u> (Greenville, Ohio) rounded out the Bluffton scoring with 119 and 123, respectively.

Bluffton will wrap up its weekend preview on Sunday, Sept. 30, before returning to Liberty, Ind. in two weeks for the HCAC Championships on OCtober 13-14.

MIDDLETOWN, Ohio - The Bluffton University men's golf team opened play at the Harrier Fall Classic with a 358 on Saturday, Sept. 29.

Michael Fimiani (Willoughby, Ohio) led a tightly-packed Bluffton squad with an 86 on Saturday. Freshman Nick Offenburger (Lexington, Ohio) was just two strokes back at 88, while sophomore Takoda Pratt (Shelby, Ohio) checksed in with a 90. Freshman Carter Mumbower (Newport, MI/Airport) rounded out the scoring four with a 94. Julian LaVallee (Jefferson, Ohio) carded a 99 and Anthony Mungia (North Baltimore, Ohio) finished day one with a 102.

BLUFFTON, Ohio - The Bluffton University football team welcomed the Mount St. Joseph Lions for an HCAC battle on Saturday, Sept. 29. Fumbles and interceptions were the difference as Bluffton struggled to get the ball in the end zone in a 21-7 setback. The defeat dropped the Beavers to 1-4 overall and 1-2 in the HCAC, while Mount St. Joseph improved to 4-1 on the season with a spotless 3-0 mark in conference play at 3-0.

The offenses were quiet in the first quarter with neither team being able to put points up on the scoreboard until the 14:03 mark in the second when Chaiten Tomlin found Nick Murphy from seven yards out to put the Lions up 7-0. Mount St. Joseph would strike again with 2:00 remaining in the half after a 6-yard touchdown pass extended the lead to 14-0. The Beavers cruised down the field and answered with a 2-yard touchdown scamper by Drake Campbell (Trenton/Edgewood) that made it 14-7 at half after three rushes by defensive end Isaac Zickafoose (Middlebury, Ind./Northridge) went for 18 yards and a first down.

<u>Plummie Gardner</u> (Lima/Perry) connected on 12-of-28 passes for 165 yards with two picks. Leading Bluffton on the ground was <u>Drake Campbell</u> who piled up 90 yards on 18 attempts with the Beavers' lone score in the game. <u>Keyon Camden</u> (Wayne/Elmwood) hauled in two catches for 59 yards while <u>Lucas Espitia</u> (Lincoln Park, Mich./Lincoln Park) snagged three balls for 40 yards.

<u>Austin Hall</u> (Piqua) tallied six tackles and an interception, while <u>Dylan Shaffer</u> (Shelby) added six tackles in the contest. <u>John Boyd III</u>(Muncie, Ind./Muncie Central) finished with five stops and a pair of sacks and Zickafoose added a sack of his own.

MSJ finished with a 10-minute edge in time of possession thanks to five Bluffton tunrovers. The Lions were flagged for 14 penalties that added up to 132 yards and six first downs for the home team. Bluffton went for 321 yards of totoal offense, compared to 383 for the visitors.

The Beavers will look to put this game behind them as they prepare for a trip to Rose-Hulman next Saturday, Oct. 6, with kickoff set for 2 p.m.
