WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

It was a battle to the bitter end Saturday afternoon at Platt Arena with the 5th-ranked Knights of Marian University (18-2, 7-1) slipping past the Huntington women's basketball team 61-60.

There are several marks of a good team and Saturday was a testament to that. A good team makes plays when it counts and that's exactly what the two-time defending national champs did midway through the fourth quarter. The Knights forced HU into six turnovers over a four-minute span to turn a five-point deficit into an 11-point advantage of 60-49 with just over two minutes to go.

The mark of a good team also never quits in the midst of adversary and Culler's crew responded accordingly in the face of MU's 16-0 run. A timeout to regroup was just what the Foresters needed to come firing back with an 11-1 run. Two Maddie Richer freebies trimmed the lead to single digits with 90 seconds to go. Richer would score once more with the shot clock winding down but otherwise it was the Hailey Krewald show.

The 5-7 hard-nosed guard scored seven points in the final minute of play. While Marian could do no wrong just minutes earlier, they were only able to convert one of their six free throws in the final 45 seconds to leave the door open for the hosts.

Beginning with Richer's two points from the charity stripe, the Foresters scored on every possession except for a long ball by Richer that looked like it was going to find the bottom of the net and would have made for an even more edge-of-your-seat finish. But as it was, HU's fast and furious finish was two point short of an upset.

It was a physical afternoon of basketball that featured four ties and five lead changes as the two teams, each priding themselves on defense, jockeyed for any sort of advantage. Leading up to the last five minutes, no more than two possessions separated the CL foes minus one possession in the middle of the third quarter.

The Foresters scored eight of their 12 first quarter points in the opening three-and-a-half minutes for an early 8-2 advantage. They were able to ride that lead the rest of the quarter to hang on for a 12-11 tilt at the first break but the second ten minutes favored the visitors. They cashed in on three of their seven from downtown to climb on top 29-23 by the midway point.

Huntington made up five points in the third quarter compliments of Cindy In't Groen who connected of three of her four free throws and scored on a fade-away in the lane for a 43-41 difference heading into the fourth where both teams put 19 points on the board to make for the one-point finish.

The two teams shot the ball similarly with HU going 21-for-51 for 41.2 percent while Marian finished 22-for-53 for 41.5 percent. The Knights canned two more threes than their hosts but Huntington converted a higher percentage of their freebies by going 13-for-14 for 92.9 percent. MU finished 10-for-19 from the line for 52.6 percent.

Krewald poured in a game- and season-best 22 points by going 8-for-12 from the field and 4-for-4 from the charity stripe. Richer added 12 points to go along with a team-high three assists. Brooke Saylor tossed in ten points, swatted five shots and took control of the boards with 19 rebounds. As a team, HU controlled the glass 40-28.

Rachel Titzer came off the bench to lead Marian with 17 points which included back-to-back triples during her team's 16-0 burst. Dejah Cyrus collected 11 points and 15 rebounds while the Foresters

limited the league's preseason player of the year in Kellie Kirkhoff to ten points.

Second round of conference play starts on Wednesday with a home contest for the Foresters (11-8, 4-4) against Goshen at 7:00 p.m.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Despite holding their visitors 23 points below their season average, the Forester men's basketball team still came up short, 69-56, to Marian University Saturday afternoon at Platt Arena.

The Knights entered the contest ranked 9th in the NAIA in scoring with their 92-point average and while HU was able to hold them to their second lowest point total of the season, Platt's crew struggled at the other end of the floor playing without their leading scorer in Tyler Arens.

Huntington shot 36.7 percent from the field (22-for-60) which included going 3-for-17 from deep with two players finishing in double digits. Trevor Lockwood paced his team with 20 points and three blocks while Konner Platt added 12 points. Devon Merder grabbed 12 rebounds and dished out four assists to lead HU in both categories.

Reggie Kissonlal, standing at 6-11, poured in 19 points and corralled 13 rebounds for Marian for his second double double of the year. Wes Stowers recorded 16 points and a game-best eight assists.

Sterling Brown chipped in ten points.

Marian dropped in 37.5 percent of their shots (27-for-72) and outscored their hosts 21-9 behind the arc. They outrebounded HU 53-35.

The Foresters got off to a great start with each starter scoring within the first six minutes to open up a ten-point advantage of 16-6.

Unfortunately, the Knights spent the next four minutes posting ten unanswered points for the game's third tie at 16-16. HU would regain the lead at 20-16 on back-to-back buckets by Lockwood but another visitor push forced the fourth and final tie at 20s at the 7:39 mark en route to a 31-28 Marian lead heading into the break.

Lockwood scored down low within the first 15 seconds of the second period to reduce the lead to just one but seven straight points by Marian upped the lead to eight at 38-30 after which Mason Coverstone dropped in a three and two minutes later scored again on a put back to cut the lead to two possessions each time.

But it was all Marian after that as HU didn't have an answer for Kissonlal who scored seven of his team's next nine points to give MU its largest lead of the day up to that point at 50-37 with just under 12 minutes to go. The lead remained in double digits for all but 45 seconds the rest of the way to make for a relatively quiet finish.

The Knights, one of the hottest teams in the league right now, have won six of their last seven outings to improve to 14-6 overall, 4-4 in league play.

The Foresters (6-14, 2-6) will look to snap their eight-game losing skid on Tuesday when they host Goshen at 7:00 p.m. in second round action of league play.

Maple Leafs Empty Bench, Use Dozen Scorers In Loss To Ranked Trojans

GOSHEN, Ind. — Every available Goshen College women's basketball player scored a point and took at least two shots while playing double-digit minutes Saturday afternoon as the Maple Leafs dropped an 84-40 Crossroads League decision to NAIA Division II no. 22 Taylor University at Gunden Gymnasium.

Playing its second game since earning national recognition, Taylor (13-7, 6-2) came out clicking on all cylinders, scoring 15 of the game's first 17 points and adding 22 more in the second period. The Trojans finished the first half shooting 15-for-29 (51.7 percent) from the floor.

Six Maple Leafs (1-19, 0-8) scored in the first half, paced by 3-pointers from Claire Rauck and Carley

O'Neal. Goshen point guard Haley Archibeque led the team with four rebounds as the hosts shot 40 percent inside the arc in the opening half. Taylor got 15 points from Kendall Bradbury and five rebounds from Cassidy Wyse while taking a 26-point lead into the locker room.

The Trojans added an 11-for-11 mark at the foul line to an 8-for-15 clip from the floor in the third period before Goshen ended the quarter on a 5-0 run. Lauren James scored eight points and Bradbury seven in the quarter, one that saw Goshen's 13 points come from seven sources.

Each team finished the fourth quarter with a 5-for-14 shooting mark and two makes on four trips to the foul line: the Trojans used their two made 3-pointers to Goshen's one to claim a 14-13 edge in the period.

Bradbury led all scorers with 22 points on 8-of-12 shooting; James finished with 13 points and Josie Cobb 10 for TU. Wyse's seven boards were a game-high while Logan Kyre paced Goshen with six. Mariah Roe scored seven points and Donnae Lipinski six for GC. Roe also added a team-high three steals.

The Maple Leafs take leave of Gunden Gymnasium for four of their next five games, sandwiching a home tilt with Indiana Wesleyan on Jan. 24 between a pair of two-game road trips. GC returns to action Wednesday at Huntington with a 7 p.m. tip-off.

Senior-Studded Goshen Offense Starts Strong Before Taylor Spawns Shortfall Heath-Granger scores 13 points in six minutes to start league loss

UPLAND, Ind. — The Goshen College men's basketball team let an opportunity to level its conference record fall by the wayside Saturday in a 76-72 Crossroads League loss to Taylor University at Gunden Gymnasium.

Goshen point guard Devin Heath-Granger led the team to a fast start, connecting on his first five shots for 13 points in the game's first six minutes. When his third 3-pointer in as many tries sank with exactly four minutes elapsed, the Maple Leafs led 16-7.

The hosts (10-10, 3-5) pushed their lead out to 21-9 at the 12:36 mark and 27-14 just after the midpoint of the half. The opening stanza was a tale of two quarters, though: after the Maple Leafs started the game 8-for-12 from the floor, Taylor finished 9-for-13 to pull within 37-35 at halftime.

Evan Crowe led Taylor (12-8, 3-5) with 10 points in the first 20 minutes: Billy Geschke chipped in 12 points on 5-of-9 shooting to come within a point of matching Heath-Granger's team high. Goshen used six offensive rebounds, including a game-high five caroms in the hands of Alhassan Barrie, to out-rebound its guests 19-16 at the half.

Unfortunately for the home side, Taylor's first-half run didn't stop at halftime: the Trojans got baskets from six players in an 18-5 run to open the second half.

After trading baskets for a handful of possessions with the margin in the low double figures, GC kicked its defense into high gear, holding the Trojans 0-for-5 with three turnovers over a five-minute span.

Between the 10:30 and 5:00 marks, Taylor's only points came at the foul line as Goshen went on a 16-5 run to re-take the lead. Grider, who scored six points in the spurt, gave GC the edge at 61-59 with a pair of free throws at 5:17.

Taylor, though, had other ideas with a run of its own. Crowe and Mason Degenkolb scored nine of the next 11 points while running Goshen's field-goal drought to almost five minutes. With 2:20 remaining, the Trojans had turned a 61-59 hole into a 68-63 lead.

Barrie converted a three-point play to get Goshen back within two, only to watch Ryan Robinson get a more conventional triple to push the lead back to two scores. A pair of Heath-Granger foul shots were followed by a stop: Taylor had run 22 seconds off the clock, but Goshen had the ball down three at 71-

68 with 1:19 to play.

Geschke's drive to the rim ended with a missed layup and a Degenkolb rebound. Opting to defend rather than fouling, GC drew a charge on the other end to get a second chance with 44 seconds left. This time, Heath-Granger missed a game-tying 3, and with the shot clock about to switch off, the Maple Leafs had to foul. Robinson and Jake Heggeland combined to go 5-of-6 at the line.

"Give credit to Taylor," said Goshen interim head coach Jon Tropf. "They mixed it up on us and got us out of rhythm. It's 100 percent my fault that our guys weren't prepared for that. We didn't come out to start the second half well, either. That's something we have to get better at and we will."

Geschke would lead all scorers with 23 points, pulling him within six of the 1,300-point plateau that only 10 Maple Leafs have reached in their careers. Heath-Granger finished the game with 15 points and a game-high eight assists: Funkhouser added 10 points before fouling out while Barrie added seven points and eight boards.

Robinson led the Trojans with 19 points off the bench, shooting 6-for-8 to go with a team-high five threes. Crowe and Heggeland added 18 and 17 points respectively, with the former draining four 3s and the latter shooting 7-of-8. Keaton Hendricks finished with nine rebounds, outdueling Barrie and Heggeland by one for the game high.

The Trojans finished with 44 rebounds to Goshen's 38; after starting the game 4-for-11 from the floor, TU made 24 of its last 47 shots to finish with a 47.5 percent clip. The Maple Leafs finished at 34.9 percent (22-for-63).

Goshen hits the road for two games next week, beginning with a visit to Huntington at 7 p.m. Tuesday.
